## SCHEDULE 1 Purposes

The purpose(s) of the Corporation shall be to:

- 1. Regulate and promote the sport of wheelchair rugby in Canada;
- Stage and sanction local, regional, provincial/territorial and national competitions;
- Manage the Canadian wheelchair rugby national team program, including participation in international competitions;
- 4. Deliver wheelchair rugby recruitment and training programs in Canada to bring athletes from the grassroots level to national and international levels;
- Oversee a structure of local clubs and regional and provincial/territorial bodies involved in the sport of wheelchair rugby;
- 6. Act as the Canadian representative to the international federation responsible for the sport of wheelchair rugby;
- 7. Undertake research and innovation initiatives pertaining to the sport of wheelchair rugby;
- 8. Regulate and promote other wheelchair sports in Canada, where there is no other responsible organization and the Corporation has identified the participation in these sports and/or organizations as a strategic priority;
- 9. Act as the Canadian representative to international federations that govern other wheelchair sports, where the Corporation has identified the participation in these sports and/or organizations as a strategic priority;
- Provide a training and certification program for coaches, classifiers and technical officials;
- 11. Provide professional development and leadership opportunities, where appropriate, to athletes, volunteers, staff and members;
- 12. Promote, increase awareness of, and advocate on behalf of wheelchair sports and athletes in Canada;
- 13. Develop and deliver, either directly or through its members, multisport wheelchair sport First Contact and Awareness programs;
- 14. Carry out fund development initiatives to support the activities of the Corporation.

# SCHEDULE 2 Additional Provisions

- 1. The Corporation shall be carried on without the purpose of gain for its members, and any profits or other accretions to the Corporation shall be used in furtherance of its purposes.
- 2. Directors shall serve without remuneration, and no director shall directly or indirectly receive any profit from his or her position as such, provided that a director may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in performing his or her duties. A director shall not be prohibited from receiving compensation for services provided to the Corporation in another capacity.
- 3. The directors may appoint one or more directors, who shall hold office for a term expiring not later than the close of the next annual general meeting of members, but the total number of directors so appointed may not exceed one-third of the number of directors elected at the previous annual general meeting of members.
