CLASSIFICATION

There will be two (2) panels of three (3) Classifiers each present throughout the duration of the tournament. If your team has players requiring classification, please note accordingly on your Team Roster Information no later than April 17, 2026.

To help us estimate the number of athletes who will require classification, please indicate on the long list which athletes need classification. The completed classification form and supporting documentation will not be due until the submission of the Final Team Roster. These forms, along with a protest form, will be distributed to teams at a later date.

The World Wheelchair Rugby Quality Assurance lead will be Paul Easton. This role has been adopted internationally, and it is used to ensure that policies and procedures are followed from all participants, including athletes, coaches, classifiers, and administrators.

All athletes who require classification must be prepared to present themselves to the classifiers at the Raven's Nest by 8:00 AM on Thursday, May 14th, so please schedule your flights accordingly. All athletes who require classification must submit their flight information to Avery Lightfoot via the Team Transportation Form no later than April 17th in order for the Head Classifier to develop an appropriate schedule. Please ensure that your athletes arrive ready for classification 15 to 20 minutes before their scheduled classification time to ensure there are no delays.

Ground transportation will be provided for athletes who require classification. Details will be communicated closer to the date.

NOTE: An online classification module will be available some time in the new year. This e-module is strongly recommended for all individuals participating in classification.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Sustainable Practices at the 2026 Wheelchair Rugby National Championships

The 2026 Wheelchair Rugby National Championships is committed to sustainability and is a non-single-use plastic event. In line with this, we will not be providing single-use water bottles. We kindly ask all participants to bring their own reusable water bottles. Water filling stations will be available throughout the competition venue to ensure easy access to hydration.

ADHESIVE POLICY

These National Championships WILL BE ADHESIVE FREE. Referees will be inspecting chairs and any chair not considered free of stickum will not be permitted on the court. There will be no spray zone, as no sprays, glues, or excessive adhesive tape will be allowed. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

DOPING CONTROL

Wheelchair Rugby Canada is a WADA compliant sport organization and, as such, the **Sport Integrity Canada** (formerly Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport) conducts doping control testing at the National Championships. Please ensure that your players understand that testing may be performed on players from any division. Please review the policies and procedures, as well as the Prohibited List on the CCES website <u>Canadian Anti-Doping Program I Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport</u> and act accordingly. These policies and procedures are compliant with the Canadian (CCES) and International (WADA) codes.

IMPORTANT – ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS FOR NATIONALS

All players, coaches, and staff who will participate at Nationals are required to complete online antidoping education ANNUALLY through CCES prior to competing.

CARDED ATHLETES OR STAFF MEMBERS ON THE NATIONAL TEAM (senior or development cards), are already required to complete this training, and are therefore NOT required to complete again in order compete at Nationals.

ATHLETES WHO ARE NOT CARDED OR NATIONAL TEAM STAFF MEMBER will be required to complete the Clean Sport (Untracked) e-learning module. PSOs are required to ensure that all athletes and staff attending Nationals have completed this course

- 2. Once on the webpage, you will need to click on Modules 1 through 8 (all listed) to learn more about different areas of anti-doping education.

- 3. Once you have completed the modules, click on Module 9 to access the Clean Sport Quiz.
- 4. When you complete the quiz, you will receive a certificate. Please SAVE this certificate and forward to your PSO as requested.

NOTES:

- You do NOT need to create an account or login to take this course.
- You MUST save your certificate. Once you close the screen, you will no longer have access to your certificate and will need to start the process over.
