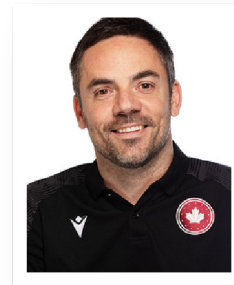

Wheelchair rugby is a fast-paced, full-contact Paralympic team sport that combines elements of rugby, basketball, and handball. Originally developed in Winnipeg, Canada in 1977, the sport is played by athletes with physical impairments affecting both the arms and legs. Today, wheelchair rugby is played in more than 40 countries around the world and continues to grow at all levels of competition.

HOW TO PLAY

Wheelchair rugby is played indoors on a basketball court with two teams of four athletes on the court at a time, with a maximum of 12 athletes per team. The objective is to score by carrying the ball across the opposing team's try line while maintaining control.

A player must bounce or pass the ball at least once every 8 seconds, and the offensive team has 40 seconds to score after gaining possession. Physical contact between wheelchairs is a key part of the game and adds to the speed, strategy, and excitement of the sport.

BASIC RULES

- Games are played in four eight-minute quarters.
- After a stoppage in play, players have 8 seconds to inbound the ball.
- A try is scored when a player crosses the try line with control of the ball.
- a defending team can have no more than three players in the key
- Players must dribble or pass the ball every 8 seconds.
- The offensive team has 12 seconds to move the ball into the front court and 40 seconds to score.
- Contact between wheelchairs is permitted, but dangerous play and physical contact between players is not allowed.
- If the score is tied, an overtime period of 3 minutes will be played. Additional overtime periods will be played until one team wins.

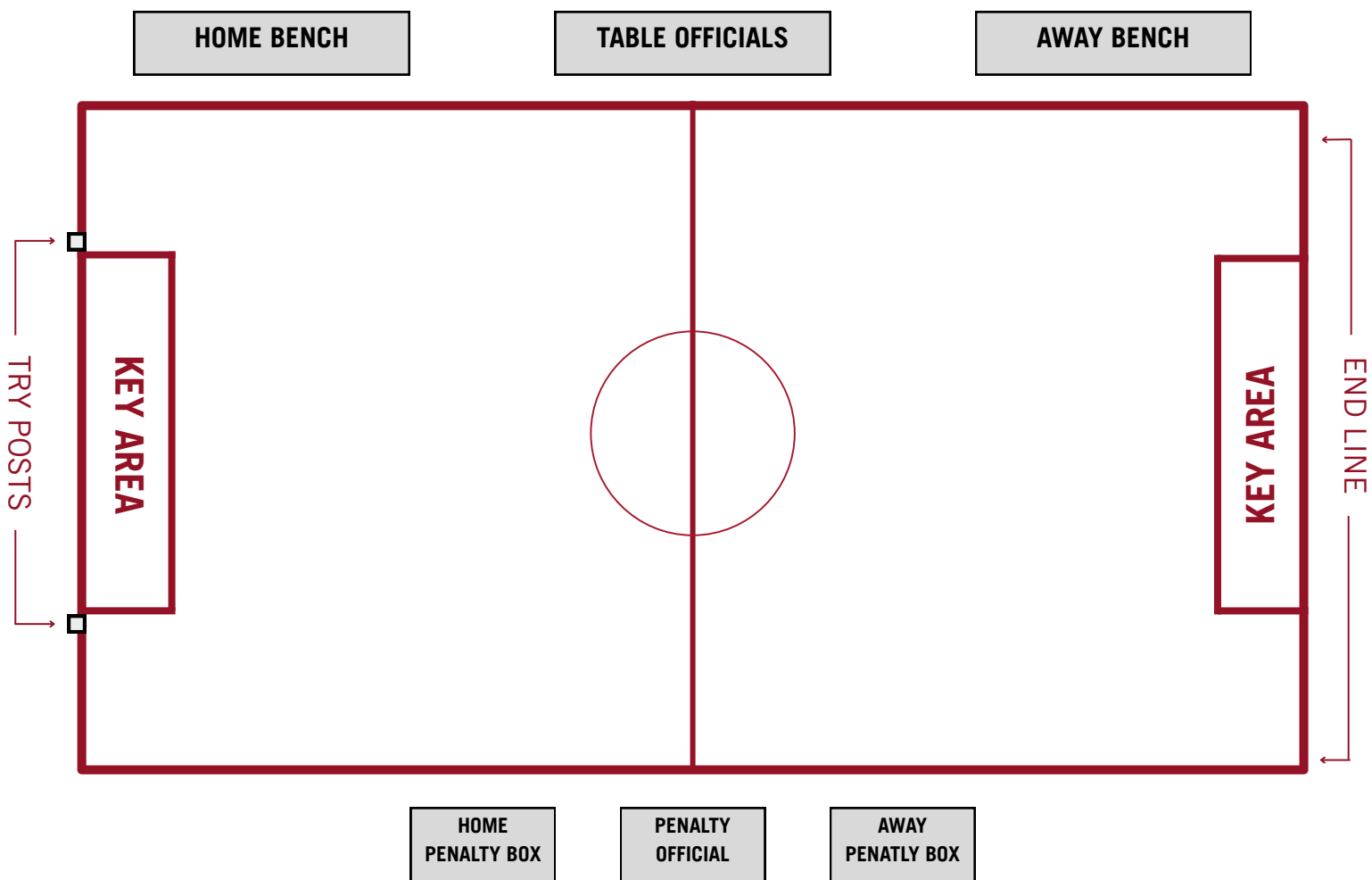

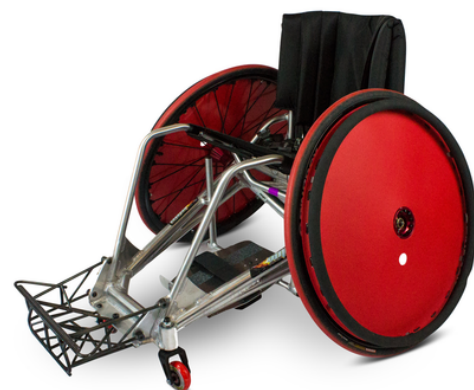

CLASSIFICATION

Wheelchair Rugby uses a classification system to ensure that athletes with different types of disabilities can compete together. When an athlete begins to play wheelchair rugby, they are evaluated by a team of qualified professionals and assigned a classification number based on their functional ability.

The classification numbers range from 0.5 (athletes with the least function) to 3.5 (athletes with the most function) and increase in 0.5 increments. The four athletes on court must total no more than 8.0 points. To be eligible to play wheelchair rugby, athletes must have an impairment affecting at least three limbs. An athlete's role in the game usually corresponds to their function.

Teams receive point additions to their on-court lineup when the following athletes are playing:

- 0.5 points for each female on court with the classification 0.5 to 1.5.
- 1.0 points for each female on court with the classification 2.0 to 3.5.
- 0.5 points for one athlete 45 years of age or older on court. (Domestic Rule)
- 1.0 points for each youth, aged 19 and under, on the court. (Domestic Rule)

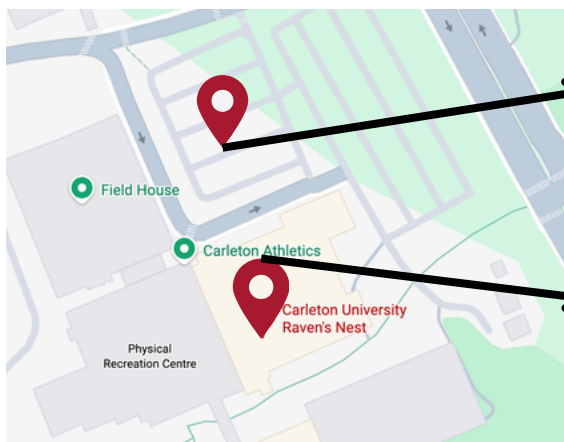

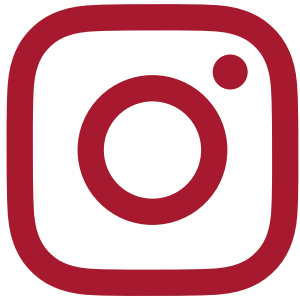
